Wine description: Subtle aromas of Boskop apples, rhubarb and roses to begin with; personifies the taut and refined notes typical of the vintage on the one hand, with hints of traditional viticultural methods on the other, and the marriage of the two elements announces the arrival of stone-fruit tastes; will undoubtedly benefit from more cellaring. (VINARIA)

VINTAGE 2005 - The beginning of the vegetations periode started slowly at the end of April. Flowering was done in a very short period in the middle of June. Changes of warm and wett conditions were throught out the vegetation periode. At the beginning of September weather stayed stable and we had a warm and sunny harvest time until mid of November. Start of main harvest was second week in October with the red wines following the light and crisp Veltliners. Riesling was harvested at the beginning of November and ended with the single vineyard Gv's on 17th of November. In the night of 27th of November a GV Icewine could be harvested.

SCHLOSS GOBELSBURG is the oldest winery in the Danube region with a documented history back to 1171. Since January 1996 the Château and winery is managed by family Michael Moosbrugger. The vineyards from the 35 ha estate are located on the slopes and terraces of the oldest vinyard sites around Langenlois. Nowadays the winemakers are interested in producing authentic and noble wines from different terroirs. The winery concentrates mainly on Grüner Veltliner and Riesling and in the selection of old authentic varieties.
